

Building and Growing to the Glory of God

Proposed Christian Life Center and the Sanctuary/Education Space

The mission of the United Methodist Church is to “Make Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World.” Our congregation's vision toward fulfilling the mission is **S.H.I.N.E. Serve. Host. Inspire. Nurture. Educate.** ~ To shine the light of Jesus so that children youth, and adults will grow in the knowledge and love of God through missions, evangelism, worship, nurture, and Christian education.

First United Methodist Church envisions an expansion of ministries and services through the construction of Christian Life Center and capital improvements as we incorporate a growing membership and changing community landscape. The project’s goal is building a Christian Life Center on our existing campus and to make capital improvements to our existing sanctuary and educational space.

The plans for building and renovation include the construction of a 49,000 square foot Christian Life Center. Included within this project is an activity center, age level classrooms, youth area, pre-school, fellowship hall, commercial kitchen, media center, and additional space for large gatherings and fellowship. Outdoor green space and playgrounds will be part of the design. In addition, our 88 year old sanctuary, a landmark of the Buford community cityscape, will undergo major capital improvements to ensure that it remains the cornerstone of Hill and Main St. You may be asking “why build?” How does this project lend itself to the prosperity and future of our church and the welfare of the Buford community? How does this project fulfill the mission and vision of the church?

1. **We’re building a foundation for future generations.** We are called to lay the groundwork for the future. The legacy we leave to the City of Buford and the surrounding area will live on for our children’s children.
2. **To provide Christian education for children, youth and adults.** We fail the future when we fail to educate. Limited space in an aging facility hinders our ability to reach further in servicing the needs of the Buford community. Educational programs and mission opportunities are critical if we are to make an impact in the future.
3. **To reach out to the community at large.** John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Movement, said, “The world is my parish.” Our vision incorporates being a resource to both the congregation and the community. Increasing our capacity and inviting use by the community provides us with the framework to grow.

More detailed information and costs will be mailed the first week in June and available on the website, along with financial pledge cards. Commitment Sunday is June 28th.

We also need to understand that the capital campaign is for the building fund and does not take the place of our general fund (annual operating budget).

Pray about what God is calling you to do and be "a wise and faithful steward, employ every part of it for such purposes as our blessed Lord has commanded us to do."
