Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

One of the things I love about Buford First UMC is the history we have here in downtown Buford. Starting out on Shadburn Ave., which was then Railroad St., on August 19, 1871, we have always been a welcoming congregation. That spirit of hospitality reached out to our community with the love of Christ, and the church grew. The church went from the first location to Church St, to the city square following a great Methodist revival in 1894, to our present location in 1927. And of course, that spirit of hospitality, led to the construction of our Christian Life Center.

It can be easy for us to be complacent, whether we are a church or in our individual lives. Many churches reach the point where they are okay with what they have, the number of people attending, the programs that exist, as long as they have the programs for them. It's easy to say, "We have enough people coming." Yet the only problem with saying that is that we are failing to see those who need the Church, the body of Christ. But that is not us, and I love our church for that reason. We see that there are people in our community that still do not know Jesus. We see the people that are hurting, isolated, and feel they do not belong. And we say, "Come join us." That has been our history.


